Proposed spend of Sports Premium 2014 – 2015

In April 2013, the Government announced new funding of £150 million for Physical Education (PE) and Sport. The funding should be used to improve the quality and breadth of PE and sport provision. It is being provided jointly by the Departments of Education, Healthy and Culture, Media and Sport. Funding will be allocated to all maintained and state-funded schools with primary phase pupils. Schools are free to determine how best to use this funding to improve the quality and breadth of PE and sport provision, including increasing participation in PE and sport so that all pupils develop healthy lifestyles and reach the performance levels they are capable of.

At St. Thomas' we received £3,766 in June 2014 and £5,705 in November 2014. The next page sets out how we have spent the premium money for the academic year 2014-2015.

At the end of the week a pupil is selected to receive the Victor Lodrum trophy, this is for outstanding sportsmanship and effort. The children are placed into teams in relation to current sporting events. E.g. Olympics, World cup (Rugby, Football). <ul style="list-style-type: none">Crown Gymnastics Equipment Ltd – annual check of gymnastics equipment in the hall. Repair necessary for some of the equipment. Keep Health & Safety of equipment up to date to ensure confidence in equipment for teachers when delivering PE lessons.Heritage Landscape Services – marking out of the football pitch and the tracks for Sports week. Marking the football pitch out on the field enables the children to have competitive matches against local schools. The sports track allowed athletics lessons and sports week to be carried out with a competitive nature.
