

## **St Thomas CEP**

### **Proposed spend of Sports Premium 2015 – 2016**

In April 2013, the Government announced new funding of £150 million for Physical Education (PE) and Sport. The funding should be used to improve the quality and breadth of PE and sport provision. It is being provided jointly by the Departments of Education, Healthy and Culture, Media and Sport. Funding will be allocated to all maintained and state-funded schools with primary phase pupils. Schools are free to determine how best to use this funding to improve the quality and breadth of PE and sport provision, including increasing participation in PE and sport so that all pupils develop healthy lifestyles and reach the performance levels they are capable of.

At St. Thomas' we have received £9806 in April 2015. The next page sets out how we have spent some of the premium money and our plans for future spending in 2015 – 2016.

| <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• T-shirts, tracksuit pants and tracksuit top to wear when delivering PE lessons</li> <li>• Raised the profile of teachers delivering PE lessons – setting the standard and expectations of each lesson. The children have commented on how smart the teachers look whilst doing PE. When out on sporting events, others schools have also made positive comments on the staff PE kit.</li> <li>• Children's hoodies and t-shirts for Sports Stars of the week.</li> <li>• A variety of sizes are now available for the sports star of the week from Reception – Y6. I introduced the t-shirt for the occasional summer days and the hotter weather! The children feel very proud of themselves if they are nominated sports star and get to wear the red t-shirt and hoody for the week. Teachers given activities to use as a resource for future teaching.</li> <li>• A programme that looked at league tables, transfer fees and budgets. This engaged the boys thoroughly. Lessons delivered outside with cross curricular links including maths which allowed children to use their skills in the outdoor setting. Linked well with the NC, especially around the objective: read, write, order and compare numbers up to 10,000,000 and determine the value of each digit.</li> <li>• PE leader to attend Lancashire New curriculum scheme of work courses for both KS1 and KS2.</li> <li>• Planning files on staff shared to access scheme of work. Easier to use lesson plans with LO's and SC. Images to help non-PE specialists. Positive feedback from colleagues on the new scheme of work, this installed confidence amongst staff leading to higher quality PE provision.</li> <li>• Supply cover. This provides every child in the school to take part in intra school competitions. Medals are allocated to pupil's individual performance and of the winning team. At the end of the week a pupil is selected to receive the Victor Lodrum trophy, this is for outstanding sportsmanship and effort. The children are placed into teams in relation to current sporting events. E.g. Olympics, World cup (Rugby, Football).</li> <li>Raised the profile of sport and competitiveness within the school. Providing the medals gave the sense of achievement and to aspire to do well. From the opening ceremony, the weeks sporting events and the closing ceremony this built on children's teamwork and sportsmanship.</li> <li>A variety of after school clubs delivered by staff to include all.</li> <li>283 Pupils took part in health and sports after school clubs which has increased since last year.
